INTRODUCTION TO THE EARLY CAREER FRAMEWORK

All qualified teachers who are employed in a relevant school in England must, by law, have completed an **induction period** satisfactorily. Statutory induction is the bridge between initial teacher training and a career in teaching. It combines two elements, both of which take a minimum of two years to achieve.

1. A structured training programme of development, support, and professional dialogue, underpinned by the Early Career Framework (ECF). This element is delivered in Gloucestershire by our Teaching School Hubs. The first section of this handbook mainly covers how this programme is delivered. Your in school mentor will also receive training from the Hubs, and will support you in the ECF programme.

2. The second element is known as the 'Statutory Induction'. This is an assessment of performance against the Teachers' Standards. This element is undertaken in school, by your headteacher and induction tutor and is supported and monitored by an Appropriate Body (AB). In most, but not all cases one of the Gloucestershire Teaching School Hubs will be your Appropriate Body.

The Gloucestershire ECF training programme aims to support you as an ECT, by providing you and your mentor with the necessary training to ensure that you can demonstrate that your performance against the Teachers' Standards is satisfactory by the end of the induction period. Induction should also provide a foundation for ECTs and equip them with the tools to be an effective and successful teacher. We provide specialist facilitators to support you in that journey. Details of this programme can be found later in the handbook.



The Early Career Teachers training programme is being delivered in Gloucestershire by Balcarras and Odyssey Teaching School Hubs in collaboration with **University College**

London (UCL) as our lead provider. Our focus is on providing the best evidenceinformed development for teachers in the first two years of their career as part of the DfE's golden thread of career development.

YEAR ONE

Year 1 is an opportunity for ECTs to engage with the Early Career Framework and learn how this aligns with the Teacher Standards.

As a Year 1 ECT you are entitled to the following:

- An additional 10% reduction in your teaching timetable
- A weekly mentor meeting with online preparation resources
- Termly in-person training delivered by an expert facilitator
- Termly online training and development resources





Year 2 offers the opportunity for ECTs to deepen their understanding of the Early Career Framework and to develop their repertoire of teaching practices through undertaking practitioner inquiries. Becoming

a skilled teacher is largely about knowing which approach to take in which situation.

As a second year ECT you are entitled to the following:

- An additional 5% reduction in your teaching timetable
- A fortnightly mentor meeting with online preparation resources
- Three in person training sessions delivered by an expert facilitator
- Two school visits

AN OUTLINE OF THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE ECF

WEEKLY MEETING

It is your statutory right to have an approximately hour long weekly meeting with your mentor in Year 1 and a fortnightly meeting with your mentor in Year 2 of the ECF. The content of these will be guided by the UCL ECF programme. You and your mentor should keep a record of these meetings to aid in tracking your progress.

2. SELF DIRECTED STUDY

ECTs are expected to do 45 minutes of Self-Directed Study in preparation for each mentor meeting using the materials on UCLeXtend. They are also expected to dedicate 15 minutes a week to enable them to enact and reflect upon their learning through the programme.

3. IN PERSON TRAINING (CLUSTER GROUP SESSIONS)

ECTs have half-termly training sessions delivered by experienced facilitators using materials from UCL. These sessions will mainly take place in person within cluster groups with other ECTs in your location or subject area. Attendance at and engagement with these sessions is essential for progression through the ECF as well as networking and collaboration (see next page).

4. ONLINE LEARNING COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The Online Learning Community (OLC) weeks are a virtual element of the programme, led by your facilitator. ECTs will be sent resources and activities to engage with via their cluster 'Padlet' board. This will involve contributing a written response in order to demonstrate engagement in the activity.

5. END OF MODULE EVALUATION FORMS

ECTs will be asked to complete an End of Module Evaluation Form (EOMEF) on UCL eXtend in the final week of each module. It is compulsory that this is completed on time, and accurately to ensure that effective delivery of the program can continue.

6. OBSERVATIONS

As part of the ECF your mentor will informally 'drop in' to observe and support you. This is not meant to be a judgemental observation. It is also encouraged throughout the ECF that the ECT observe lessons, or portions of lessons, by experienced teachers. This is an excellent opportunity to see the range of expertise in your school. Please be aware that as part of the statutory induction ECTs will also be formally observed termly by Induction tutors. Try to prepare for the formal observations by checking your school's requirements for lesson plans and expectations for observations

IN PERSON TRAINING & OLCS

The in-person training and OLCs are a really exciting part of the Gloucestershire UCL programme. We have carefully selected a team of experienced facilitators to deliver this training. We have placed you in cluster groups based on your subject area (if you are a Secondary phase teacher) or by location (if you are a Primary phase teacher).

You will receive a list of personalised dates letting you know where your cluster sessions are, and at which school it will be held. We have worked hard to find schools who have the facilities that we need.

TeachGlos, our admin support team, will communicate this information with you so look out for emails from them. Attendance at the events is compulsory. If you need to change group, or swap a session the request must come from your induction tutor to the team at TeachGlos in advance of the day. You will be required to complete the register on the day of attendance using a QR code. If you miss the session, you will have to watch a recording provided by UCL. Once you get your dates, let your cover manager at school know that you will be absent and ensure that you follow your school procedures.
