I was reflecting last week that this time three years ago, we had submitted our bid to become a Teaching School Hub and were awaiting news of whether or not we had been successful. Roll on three years and I can't quite believe what the Gloucestershire schools have achieved. When combining our work with that of Odyssey our sister TS Hub based at Pate's, we now have...

- A team of approximately 20 strategic, operational and administrative staff designing and developing our programmes.
- In the region of 40 expert facilitators delivering programs (who represent schools and organisations from all phases of education across Gloucestershire).
- Over 2000 teachers who have been involved in either the ECF, NPQs or CPD programmes
- We have firmly established strong relationships with all curriculum hubs and stakeholders in the region.

Many of you reading this newsletter have been directly involved, and I do hope that your reflections are similar to mine, in that the Teaching School Hub program has been revolutionary in putting professional development of our staff at the heart of all we do. That its impact on our children has been overwhelmingly positive. We are always keen to hear your feedback whether that be positive or areas for improvement so please do get in touch if you feel the need.

In other news, I am delighted to hear of the designation in the Summer of the Gloucestershire Research School at Rowanfield Junior School / the GLA . 



It has already been a busy year in the Hub for our ECTs but before looking at that I'd like to mention our ECTs who completed the programme last year. We are incredibly proud of the colleagues who we worked with over the two years and witnessing their progress in their teaching careers and engagement in the ECT programme was

a pleasure. We had a brilliant event to celebrate the achievement of those ECTs who completed the programme at the end of the summer term and enjoyed getting to hear the next steps that ECTs are looking to make. Look out for information about the celebration event we will hold this year on 27 June 2024.

This year we have a total of 474 ECT's and 376 Mentors within Gloucestershire and we enjoyed getting to meet so many of you at our training events in September. The feedback on these events has been extremely positive. If you were unable to make these, or would like a refresher, the resources are available on your Padlet boards.

ECT2s are now well on their way with considering how to undertake a practitioner inquiry and the discussions and reflections on these at their training events has been really interesting. It is fascinating to hear the varied experiences that ECT's have had over the last year and to see the progress they are making. We spoke to one ECT about her experience at starting her second year recently and she said:

'I have really enjoyed being an ECT year 2 and being able to 'get my teeth into' the practitioner inquiry. I am learning more about my practice and ways to improve teaching and learning and then implement this into my teaching.

I am enjoying this year much more than Year 1 as I am able to reflect and investigate to hopefully find the answers to some of my questions."

As a Hub we are passionate about the training programme we have created that enables ECTs to meet, in person, with our ECTs from across the county. We are aware that this has an impact on cover within schools, but we feel that the benefit of ECTs having time to network and reflect on their practice whilst engaging with the most up-to-date research in education is huge. We know that as a county our schools prioritises good quality CPD and enable staff to attend training where appropriate so we thank you for your support in this with your ECTs.

- In September we delivered training to over 700 ECT's mentors and Induction tutors

- We are Appropriate body for 87 schools in our Hub area.





I decided to pursue Senior Leadership mainly because at every stage of my career, I have always sought a new challenge. The NPQ relaunch coincided with the start of a new academic year, so I decided to give it a go. I certainly didn't regret it. One day, I may pursue a role in Senior Leadership, so it seemed like a great opportunity. I was certainly right. The workload was a significant concern and did require a small adjustment in my routines. Fortunately, a manageable habit formed of being able to do most of the course preparation on a Saturday morning.



I loved the excuse to not walk the dog and/or get out of my pyjamas, meaning that I did every task as I embraced everything that came my way.

I think the NPQ in Senior Leadership brought about a dynamic shift in my understanding that, to date, has only really happened during the PGCE! I have made many changes to my practice as a current Head of Department. I would like to think I have elicited a great deal of change in my school. I now know just how important it is to be an effective leader, as change in a whole school setting impacts all of our learners. The NPQ utilises both local and global perspectives on the importance of embedding school culture and, of course, the crucial importance of behavior. My students have benefited from fresh approaches in exploring the SEND, curriculum, governance, and accountability domains.

In summary, I can certainly recommend this NPQ to any existing or aspiring Senior Leader. The knowledge and connections it has offered me have been a genuine boost to my confidence in my career.







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

The GLA are delighted to announce that after a very rigorous process, the trust has been selected to join the EEF Research School Network in September. Our new Research School will be named the Gloucestershire Research School (based at Rowanfield Junior School) and will be the first ever Research School in the county! The new Research School Network will include 33 schools nationally that will continue to focus on bringing evidence informed practice into schools in line with the EEF vision.


